



Career

Professionals “LIED TO ME”

Undergoing college in four years was an identity crisis I didn't become aware of until recently. As many college students do, I identified myself by walking around with pieces of others' traits during the pickup and drop-off cycle. I picked up traits that hindered me from truly KNOWING who God is: unforgiveness, gossiping, discord, people pleasing, and discouragement. I dropped off traits such as negativity, sarcasm, and anxiety.

This has allowed me to reflect on how much we can consume in just four years. The college lifestyle can become so “fast” that we forget where we left off. We left behind childlike happiness. We left behind the values of others. We left behind true love. We left God behind. But we continue to remain in self, operating from a place of “Imma do this for me,” driven by selfish ambition.

“For I know the plans I have for you,” declares the Lord, “plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future.”

As a college student, my identity was also defined by my college resume. Often, as students, if we feel as though we are not doing anything, whether it's coursework, an internship, or joining organizations, we think we are not worth anything. This allows you to forget who you are in God's presence, truly. We become so adaptive in trying to answer the questions many ask us from interviewers, WHO ARE YOU? We immediately respond with our names, undergraduate years, and majors, as if those are the only things tied to us. I wondered for so long how many people who answered that question ever looked outside those three answers and tried to understand who they are in God. I lost my identity in college... it was something I had been working so hard for, and I thought I had obtained. Still, I soon realized that the deeper I went into God, the more I realized that everything in the physical couldn't mirror what God has to offer me in the spiritual.

Answering what I thought was a simple question in the physical proved to be a complex answer in the spiritual. I became stagnant in my spirituality and could only identify myself in the physical. As the chapter, Who Is Me? Demonstrates how the consumption of this world can lead to cross-contamination with and from others. Operating from a place of misperceptions and an identity crisis underscored by physicality rather than spirituality, Patrick identifies that the perception of truly learning oneself can be found in God's heart. To know oneself, one must first understand who God is. By opening ourselves up in the spirit, everything else will flow naturally in the physical world. By doing so, we align ourselves with God's heart. As Patrick further breaks down the identities God consists of and who He calls us to be, I learned how to build the foundation for aligning my spirit with God's spirit.

First, learning that God calls you to be his special possession. I once thought I identified with this powerful statement because of the individual actions I was seeking..."First generational college student coming from an immigrant household, pursuing higher education." It sounded too good to be true, as my familiarity was supposed to be built on failure. Throughout those four years in college, I was looked up to as an independent, inspiring leader with a genuine desire to help others. I thought this was what it means to be His special possession.

But yet, my spirit still felt corrupted. My identity became split into two. The identity I showed others and the identity I was trying to hide from God. I couldn't bear to understand that, despite all the efforts I am making in college, I am being applauded by those I deemed higher than me because of their impressive college resumes, and their will to create an impact on others' lives.



How could it even be possible that my biggest insecurity, hidden from many but identified by God, was my spirit?

When I had moments with the Holy Spirit rather than a lifestyle centered on the Holy Spirit, I thought everything I was doing was ordained by God. I had good intent, but kept a broken spirit. There was an invisible line between moments with Christ and moments with self. The line became so thin for me that I didn't realize how much I was in my own way.

It was time for me to strip away the titles others gave me, humbly, and who I thought I was, to be present fully, in learning: *Who Is Me* is created by God.


It's not that she will be someone or something one day. She is someone and is something.

Slow “Me” Down

Post-grad life was one I thought I was prepared for, but, truthfully, I was living in fear. I knew how spiritually broken I was and how much that brokenness would consume me moving back home. I was afraid of going back to who I was at 18. At 22, I had titles behind my name that college exposed me to. I thought going back home would shrink me back to my old self, my old ways- negativity. At 22, unaware that I was already operating in my old self/ways, I had goals written out with an open heart and destined to be my true desires, but was soon to be exhorted in a state of fear: Pass the NCLEX on my first attempt, secure an RN job, and begin volunteering in underserved communities. As my true desires were slowly being overturned by brokenness and fear, my spirit was constantly at war with what the enemy had set out for me, leaving me depleted.

Finally, a check off behind my biggest goal... I passed my NCLEX on my first attempt. It was a true accomplishment that was meant to be celebrated. From congratulations from many asking what's next and sayings of approval -"you made it"-to shame and doubt from those closest to me in just a matter of 2 months, because job security was not coming along quickly enough. I can tell you I had more doubt than celebration rooted in me. I was quickly on to my next goal in life.


The remaining goals I wrote and believed God could do, as He always has, were not being checked off this time around. I questioned myself...I questioned Him. I thought that if I didn't have a job right after post-grad, I would be deemed to be doing nothing with my life. This is the mindset everyone around me was familiar with, the “busy” mindset. You had to look busy to show others you were active...to prove to yourself that you were worthy of doing something that felt “purpose-driven.”

Driven by career, possessions, materialism, titles, and validation from others, we begin to confuse God's purpose with “my” purpose. The security God already gives us, as we are His children, began to be overlooked and overruled by insecurities filled with other idols.

After two months at home and feeling the weight of others on me, whether through celebration or disappointment, I became someone unrecognizable, with fake smiles and helping hands. I was confined to the feelings of emptiness that resided within me.

What I thought about home, what I thought about securing a job, and what I felt about myself changed all within God's timing. As spiritually broken as I was, I met Patrick at a time that God truly ordained. The true definition of “perfect time.”

Under his discipleship, Prophet Pat has a spirit that continues to challenge my spirit to know God while learning to operate just as Jesus Christ did. Patrick utilized his spiritual gifts to guide and protect me, leading me to become a discipler of Christ.

A time in my life when everything was “slowing down.” God took everything away from me, my selfish ambitions, uncompleted goals, and went into a season of isolation with just Him and me. God’s goal during this season was for his daughter to KNOW HIM ALL THE WAY. He used Patrick as a connector for me to build in the spirit.

As Patrick describes “God Knows Me,” one of my favorite chapters, because I resonated so deeply with the prophetic language he uses to pull us closer in understanding the season of “slowing down.” He starts by recognizing his athletic talents and using those same traits in his ministry. A powerful message that allowed him to save many souls, yet he still felt disconnected from God.

As Patrick describes “God Knows Me,” one of my favorite chapters, because I resonated so deeply with the prophetic language, he uses to pull us closer in understanding the season of “slowing down.”

TRIPLE A

imma do me.

Appraised by the people around him, he believed that the same gestures recognized by many would also work with God, and that his approval from God comes through his actions. Using the tactics of an athletic game, he describes himself as a bench player in God’s eyes. He had to take time out once more to be fully seated in the presence of God and not of mankind. As stated, *“I thought that my accomplishments would win the approval of God. That’s what life is about for many of us- how much we can do. I had to learn that if I was going to please God, there were three things I had to work on daily.”* - Patrick B.

As a healthcare professional, a Triple A is a medical emergency considered a life-or-death event. In prophetic language, Patrick’s situation was a life-or-death situation that required him to relearn himself through God. He uses the Triple A framework — Amends, Authority, and Authenticity — as the three things he works on daily.

Amends: *Above all else, guard your heart, for everything you do flows from it.* - Proverbs 4:23

-Patrick describes this as examining his heart in God’s eyes, with the example of learning how to forgive others in a wholesome way.

Authority: *Taking life upon yourself and not accepting the counsel of those God has placed as representatives of His authority on earth will cause unnecessary blockages and obstacles that many Christians now face.* - Patrick B.

-Patrick deciphers between operating from a place of pride that can cause blockages in your life, and operating through God, which can cause a flow of abundance.

Authenticity: *God’s [stand]ards is your protection from the enemy gaining territory in your life, and when you conform, you lose the protection that standards give.* -Patrick B.

-Patrick describes conforming to the enemy as what withdraws you from God’s purpose in your life. God’s purpose in our lives is beyond the measures that this world can give us. As we pour more into the Holy Spirit, we naturally move towards Christ as a lifestyle rather than just a moment.

Leaving “ME” BEHIND




I always identified as a young woman with many dreams. To many, I was inspirational, disciplined, intelligent, motivational...a woman with purpose. At one point in time, those words kept me going, but soon enough, what felt like affirmations became filler words. I was holding onto multiple personalities, but the two most common were one built on studiousness and the other, ill-founded. I was able to easily carry both personalities into one vessel without either interfering with the other. Through my studiousness, I was preaching to others about the various purposes in life. One purpose is in your career, and how it influences who you are, rather than creating who you are. I wanted people to truly know themselves, not solely on the basis of the titles their careers offered.

My spirit was attached to an entity that attracted negativity. Turning my life around to allow my spirit to be attracted to Christ was a challenge I didn't think would be.




Take Me Home: November 2023

As this was a sign of restoration for my spirit/soul and dying to my flesh, I knew then that my spirit, my mind, my heart, and my body could only be aligned with His.

I say this to say that where there is darkness, there is light. Govern My Identity is an outlet for over a thousand people out there who desire to *know* God. He lives in all of us and wants us to come to Him, not just sometimes or most times, but in all times.
